Subject: **HOT AND HUMID WEATHER LIKELY IN MOST PARTS OF THE PROVINCE**

Pakistan Meteorological Department has informed that:

- Hot and humid weather likely in most parts of the province.
- Partly cloudy and humid with chances of light rain / drizzle at isolated places in Tharparkar district tomorrow.
- Sukkur, Guddu, and Kotri Barrages are witnessing Low-level flood.

Note: River Indus at Guddu and Sukkur is expected to attain very high flood on 4th to 5th September.

RIVERS' CATCHMENTS' (29th AUG-25 TO 04th SEP-25)**


RAINFALL OUTLOOK:

Moderate rainfall activity is likely to continue over the upper catchments of all the major rivers; intensity of rainfall may enhance from moderate to heavy from 30th August to 2nd September.

FLOOD SITUATION IN MAJOR RIVERS:

WARNING:

- **EXCEPTIONALLY High Flood level** will continue in river Sutlej at Ganda Singh Wala and downstream.
- River Ravi at Shahdara will gradually decrease from **EXCEPTIONALLY High to High Flood level** during next 24-hours
- River Chenab at Trimmu is expected to attain **EXCEPTIONALLY High Flood level** during next 24-hours.
- River Chenab at Panjnad is expected to attain **Very High flood level on 2nd September.**
- River Indus at Guddu and Sukkur is expected to attain **very high flood on 4th and 5th September** respectively.
