Subject: RAIN-WIND / THUNDERSTORM SHOWER IN VARIOUS DISTRICTS OF SINDH

Pakistan Meteorological Department has informed that yesterday's low pressure area over Northwest Madhya Pradesh and adjoining East Rajasthan (India) now lies as a well-marked low pressure over Southeast Rajasthan (India) and adjoining Sindh Due to this system strong monsoon currents likely to penetrate in eastern parts of the province from today. Under its influence:

- Widespread Rain-Wind/Thundershower with scattered heavy to very heavy falls are expected in Tharparker, Umerkot, Mirpurkhas, Sanghar, Khairpur, Shaheed Benazirabad, Matiari, Tando Muhammad Khan, Tando Allahyar, Hyderabad, Thatta, Badin, Sujawal, Jamshoro districts from **today** (evening/night) till **10th** September with occasional gaps.
- While widespread Rain-Wind/Thundershower with scattered moderate to isolated heavy falls are likely in Dadu, Larkano, Shikarpur, Kashmore, Sukkur, Jacobabad, Ghotki districts from **7th to 10th** September with occasional gaps.
- Rain-Wind/Thundershower with a few moderate to isolated heavy falls are likely in Karachi division from tomorrow evening to **11th** September with occasional gaps.
- Guddu, Sukkur and Kotri Barrages are witnessing **Low-level** flood.

Note: River Indus at Guddu is expected to attain **very high level flood on 7th September.**

Possible Impacts & advises:

- **Heavy downpour/windstorm and lightning may affect daily routines, urban flooding, water logging in low lying areas in Mirpurkhas, Shaheed Benazirabad, Tharparker, Khairpur, Sukkur, Larkano, Thatta, Badin, Sujawal, Hyderabad, and Karachi and may damage weak structures like roof/wall of Kacha houses, electric poles, bill boards, vehicles and solar panels etc. during the forecast period.**
- **Farmers are advised to manage their activities keeping in view the weather forecast.**
