Subject: **RAIN-WIND / THUNDERSHOWER IS EXPECTED IN SINDH PROVINCE**

Pakistan Meteorological Department has informed that yesterday's deep depression is lying over Southwest Rajasthan and adjoining Southeastern Sindh. It will continue to move nearly West / Northwest-ward as a deep depression across Southeast Pakistan and weaken gradually into depression during next 24 hours. Due to this system strong monsoon currents are continually penetrating in the province. Under its influence:

- Widespread Rain-Wind/Thundershower with strong gusty winds along with scattered heavy to very heavy/isolated exceptional heavy falls are expected in, Tharparkar, Umerkot, Mirpurkhas, Sanghar, Khairpur, Shaheed Benazirabad, Dadu, Matiari, Tando Muhammad Khan, Tando Allahyar, Hyderabad, Thatta, Badin, Sujawal, Jamshoro districts and Karachi division till 10<sup>th</sup> September with occasional gaps.
- Widespread Rain-Wind/Thundershower with scattered moderate to isolated heavy / very heavy falls are likely in Larkano, Shikarpur, Kashmore, Sukkur, Jacobabad, Ghotki districts till 10<sup>th</sup> September with occasional gaps.
- Guddu experienced **Medium** level flood, while Sukkur and Kotri Barrages are witnessing **Low**-level flood.

**Note: River Indus at Guddu is expected to attain **very high level flood** on 8<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> September.**

- **Flash flooding in hill torrents of Dadu district.**
- **Water level may rise in Hub Dam. More rains in flood affected areas of the province may exacerbate the situation.**
- **Strong gusty winds may damage weak structures damage weak structures like roof/wall of Kacha houses, electric poles, bill boards, vehicles and solar panels etc. during the forecast period.**
- **Farmers are advised to manage their activities keeping in view the weather forecast.**
