Subject: **STRONG MONSOON CURRENTS ARE PENETRATING INTO MOST PARTS
OF THE PROVINCE**

Pakistan Meteorological Department has informed that **Strong Monsoon currents are penetrating** into most parts of the province. Under its influence:

- Widespread rain/Thunderstorm with few moderate to **isolated heavy/very heavy falls** likely in Jacobabad, Shikarpur, Larkano, Kamber Shahdadkot, Ghotki, Sukkur, Kashmore, Naushahro Feroze, Dadu, Mirpurkhas, Sanghar, Khairpur, Shaheed Benazirabad, Hyderabad, Jamshoro, Tando Muhammad Khan, Tando Allahyar, Umerkot, Thatta, Sujawal, Badin, Matiari, Tharparker districts and Karachi division **till 22nd August** with occasional gaps.
- Guddu Barrage experiencing a low-level flood, whereas Sukkur and Kotri Barrages are witnessing normal water flow.

Possible Impacts & advises:

- Heavy downpour/windstorm and lightning may affect daily routines, urban flooding, water logging in low lying areas and may damage weak structures like roof/wall of Kacha houses, electric poles, bill boards, vehicles and solar panels etc. during the forecast period.
- Farmers are advised to manage their activities keeping in view the weather forecast. Also avoid unnecessary open exposure during Thunderstorm and keep livestock in safe shelters to prevent lightning strike.

2. Moreover, Pakistan Meteorological Department has also issued **Quantitative Flood Forecast of Gauging Stations** (in thousands of cusecs) which is reproduced as under:
