Subject: **STRONG MONSOON CURRENTS ARE CONTINUOUSLY PENETRATING IN
MOST PARTS OF THE PROVINCE**

Pakistan Meteorological Department has informed that Strong monsoon currents are continuously penetrating in most parts of the province. Under its influence:

- Wind-Thunderstorm/rain with moderate to few heavy falls likely in Ghotki, Khairpur Mirs, Sanghar, Mirpurkhas, Umerkot, Tharparker, Badin, Thatta, Sujawal, Jamshoro, Hyderabad, Tando Muhammad Khan, Tando Allahyar, Matiari, Sukkur, Shikarpur, Shaheed Benazirabad, Naushahro Feroze, Jacobabad, Kashmore, Larkano, Dadu, Kambar Shahdadt districts and Karachi division with occasional gaps till tomorrow i.e. **21st July, 2025.**

Possible Impacts:

- **Heavy Falls** may cause water logging/Urban flooding in low laying areas over upper parts of the Province.
- **Heavy downpour/windstorm** and lightning may affect daily routines, weak structures like roof/wall collapse of Kacha houses, electric poles, bill boards, vehicles and solar panels etc. during the period.
- **Farmers** are advised to manage their activities keeping in view the weather forecast.
- There is also a possibility of flash flooding in the vicinity of kirthar range and the nullahs of east Balochistan.

2. Moreover, Pakistan Meteorological Department has also issued **Quantitative Flood Forecast of Gauging Stations** (in thousands of cusecs) which is reproduced as under:

SUBJECT: RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

The River Indus is currently in low flood level at Tarbela, Chashma and Taunsa, whereas all other major rivers are flowing within their normal flows. River Indus at Taunsa is expected to attain **Medium flood level**. **There is also a possibility of flash flooding in the vicinity of Kirthar range and the nullahs of east Balochistan.**

Alert: Medium to high level flows is expected in rivers Chenab and Jhelum along with nullahs of rivers Ravi, Chenab and Jhelum from 22nd to 24th July.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

1. Yesterday's well-marked low over northwest Rajasthan now lies over northeast Sindh and adjoining areas. It is likely to weaken over the next 24 hours. However, it is expected to draw **STRONG MOISTURE INFLUX** from the Arabian Sea towards the upper catchments of the eastern rivers particularly, including the River Jhelum.
2. Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northwest Afghanistan today lies over northeast Afghanistan.
3. Moderate to strong Monsoon currents from Arabian Sea are penetrating to the lower half of the country while light to moderate currents has started to penetrate upper half of the country.
4. Seasonal low lies over Northwest Balochistan.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

Scattered to widespread thunderstorm/rain with isolated **Heavy falls** and **very Heavy Falls** at few places are expected over Sindh, East Balochistan and Bahawalpur Division.

Isolated thunderstorm/rain is also expected over the upper catchments of all the major rivers along with north northeast Punjab.

IV: WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS

Alert: MODERATE TO STRONG MONSOON activity is likely to start over the upper catchments of rivers **Sutlej, Ravi, Chenab** and **Jhelum** with some extent rivers **Kabul** and **Indus** after 36-hours.
