

#### Weather Forecast

#### Weather Outlook:

Pakistan Meteorological Department has informed that the **deep depression** over Rann of Kutch, India has moved very slowly west / southwestwards and may emerge into northeast Arabian Sea along Sindh coast by late night / tomorrow morning. Due to this weather system strong monsoon currents are penetrating in Southern Sindh. Under its influence:

- Widespread rain/ wind-thunderstorms with scattered heavy-very heavy to isolated extremely heavy falls likely in Tharparker, Badin, Thatta, Sujawal, Hyderabad, Tando Muhammad Khan, Tando Allahyar, Matiari, Umerkot, Mirpurkhas, Sanghar, Jamshoro, Dadu, Shaheed Benazirabad districts, and Karachi division till 31st August with occasional gaps.
- Rain/ wind-thunderstorms with few heavy to isolated very heavy falls likely in Ghotki, Sukkur, Khairpur, Kashmore, Kambar Shahdadkot, Larkano, Naushahro Feroze, Jacobabad, and Shikarpur districts till 31st August with occasional gaps.
- Flood Forecasting Division of Pakistan Meteorological Department has also informed that Flash Flooding is expected in the areas along Kirthar ranges, Jacobabad, Kambar Shahdadkot, Dadu & Jamshoro. Urban Flooding is also expected in the metropolitan cities of Sindh. (Bulletin No. C-076/24 dated: 29th Aug 2024, copy attached)

#### **Possible Impacts:**

- Torrential rains may generate urban flooding/rain inundation in Karachi, Tharparker, Badin, Thatta, Sujawal, Hyderabad, Tando Muhammad Khan, Tando Allahyar, Matiari, Umerkot, Mirpurkhas, Sanghar, Jamshoro, Dadu, Shaheed Benazirabad districts.
- Heavy Falls may cause localized water logging in low laying areas of Ghotki, Sukkur, Khairpur, Kashmore, Jacobabad, Kambar Shahdadkot, Naushahro Feroze, Larkano, and Shikarpur districts.
- Heavy Falls over Kirthar and adjoining hill torrents of Balochistan may generate flash flooding in local nullah's/streams of Dadu, Kambar Shahdadkot, Jacobabad, and Jamshoro districts during forecast period.
- Heavy downpour/windstorm and lightning may affect daily routines, weak structures like roof/wall collapse of Kacha houses, electric
  poles, bill boards, vehicles and solar panels etc. during the forecast period.
- Sea conditions likely to remain rough to very rough with squally winds of 30-40 Kts during the forecast period.
- Fishermen are advised not to venture in open sea till 31st August.

# Recommended Actions for DDMAs / Line Departments / Other Relevant Authorities

#### Rainfall / Dust-storm / Wind-thunderstorm / Cyclonic Storm

- Conduct extensive public awareness campaigns through multiple channels, including TV/ broadcast / social / print media etc., to ensure that vulnerable communities are well-informed about the anticipated flood situation and necessary precautions.
- Enhance deployment of required machinery, equipment, emergency supplies and personnel in at-risk areas, considering on ground situation.
- Maintain sufficient stocks of essential supplies, including food, clean water, medical provisions, and sanitation supplies in case further emergent needs.
- Strategically position flood fighting equipment in areas prone to flooding, ensuring their availability for immediate deployment.
- Ensure timely cleaning / de-silting & maintenance of sewerage lines, storm water drains and nullahs.
- Ensure availability / functionality of all essential flood response equipment in flood-prone areas.
- Ensure full staffing / availability of trained emergency response personnel and designate their duties / areas of deployment in case of emergency.
- Conduct thorough reconnaissance of vulnerable locations, identifying critical infrastructure / communities that may require additional support and protection.
- Inform and sensitize residents of low-lying areas / at-risk communities of anticipated flood conditions, potential impacts, evacuation procedures and precautionary measures.
- Establish temporary shelters in safe locations for displaced individuals and ensure these are equipped with necessary supplies (food, clean drinking water, medical supplies and sanitation facilities).
- Ensure the availability of trained medical staff and ambulances in strategic locations to provide immediate medical assistance to those affected by floods.
- Implementing effective regulation strategies at headworks / barrages to optimize the discharge of excess water through irrigation channels.
- Proactive monitoring / maintenance / repairs of canal systems to enhance their capacity to handle increased flows.
- Undertake prompt repairs of any breaches / breaks in flood protective works.
- Inform travelers / tourists / in timely manner regarding anticipated weather / flood conditions, potential hazards, precautionary measures, and recommended alternative routes to regulate their travel and ensuring safety.
- Provide necessary assistance and support to travelers / tourists affected by flood situation, including evacuations if required.
- District Disaster Management Authorities (DDMAs) of flash flood prone districts are to maintain continued liaison with the DDMAs of districts of adjacent province to monitor the flow of water in streams and natural catchments.
- Ensure arrangement of rescue boats and transport for possible evacuation of population from offshore islands/low lying/ creek areas.
- Ensure arrangement for removal of fallen trees, wires, bill boards, solar panels and other loose objects.
- Prepare for possible evacuation of residents from old buildings/Kutcha Houses and vulnerable coastal locations
- The Sindh Building Control Authority shall advise owners of under construction structures/weak structured buildings to take precautions to ensure that no debris or building fall on people during the predicted cyclone storm.

### Precautionary Measures for General Public

#### Rainfall / Dust-storm / Wind-thunderstorm / Cyclonic Storm

- Monitor the weather alerts through print media, electronic media, & social media.
- Stay indoor unless absolutely necessary. Keep doors and windows shut and avoid sitting near windows as rain is often
  accompanied by strong winds.
- Maintain a distance from power lines or electrical wires. If you notice any loose electric wires in your area, alert the authorities immediately.
- Avoid touching electrical switches or outlets while it is raining. Do not try using electrical sockets or outlets outdoors while it is raining
- Avoid driving during heavy rain or dusty winds because of poor visibility.
- Avoid underpasses, drainage ditches, low-lying areas and areas where water collects.
- Check on family members who are especially at risk from weather hazards: young children, older adults, and the chronically ill.
- Avoid parking near walls, weak structures, under trees and billboards & hoardings that pose a danger to public safety.
- Residents of flash flood prone areas and coastal area are advised to remain informed and be prepared of possible evacuation during emergency situation.

## > RAINFALL OUTLOOK:

Warning: Widespread thunderstorm rain of HEAVY TO VERY HEAVY intensity with isolated EXTREMELY HEAVY falls may occur over Sindh (all divisions) and Balochistan (Zhob, Sibbi, Nasirabad, Loralai, Kalat and Makran divisions) and South Punjab (DG Khan, Multan and Bahawalpur divisions), during next 48 hours.

Wet spell is likely to decrease after 48 hours in Sindh and South Punjab. However, monsoon activity is likely to continue over Balochistan for further 24 hours.

# > FLOOD SITUATION IN MAJOR RIVERS:

No significant change is expected in the flows of any of the major rivers.

## Warning (up to 31st August):

FLASH FLOODING is expected in the areas along Kirthar ranges (Jacobabad, Qambar Shahdadkot, Dadu and Jamshoro districts) and Sulaiman ranges (DG Khan and Rajanpur districts) including nullahs in Balochistan (Zhob, Loralai, Sibbi, Nasirabad and Kalat division). Urban flooding is also expected in the metropolitan cites of Sindh.



#### Subject: Potential Cyclonic Strom Over Northeast Arabian Sea

- 1. A deep depression over Rann Kuch, India is approaching west-southwest of Pakistan about 277 km southeast of Karachi. The system is likely to move west / southwest and emerge into northeast Arabian sea along Sindh coast by late night / tomorrow morning.
- 2. Under its influence, wide spread rains / wind / thunder storms with very heavy to isolated very heavy to extremely heavy falls are likely in Tharparker, Badin, Thatta, Sujawal, Hyderabad, Tando Muhammad Khan, Tando Allah Yar, Matiari, Umerkot, Mirpur Khas, Sanghar, Jamshoro, Dadu and Shaheed Benazirabad districts and Karachi Division till 31st August with occasional gaps.



- 3. Under the said Cyclone Storm following are the likely impacts:-
  - a. Sea Conditions are likely to remain rough to very rough with squally winds 50-60 km / hour.
  - b. Coastal Flooding may occur along Sindh-coast.
  - c. Pluvial flood / inundation may occur in low lying areas of Sindh.
  - d. Windstorms may damage crops, loose structures, etc.
  - e. Thunderstorms to increase risk of lightning strikes.
  - f. Electricity / other utility services may get disrupted.
  - g. Fisherman are advised not to venture int sea till 31 August 2024.
  - General public is advised to avoid visiting the seaside and beaches and remain cautious of loose structures like billboards, electrical poles, solar panels and hoardings.
- 4. All concerned Federal Ministries / Departments, respective Provincial Governments, their line departments including PDMA Sindh, DDMAs / local administrations, municipal authorities of major metropolises are advised to **ensure following** along with any other measures deemed necessary: -

#### a. Aspects for Mass Awareness / Enforcement

- (1) During thunderstorms and to avoid lightning strike do not do the following:-
  - (a) Do not stand close to telephone or electric pylons.
  - (b) Do **not use landline telephones** and any metal / wiring that is not grounded.
  - (c) Do not take cover under trees.
  - (d) Move away from drainage canals and pondages.
  - (e) Move indoors or seek shelter in a dry place.
- (2) Do not risk crossing any drain or road overtopping with water flow. Wait for flows to normalize and priorities / ensure safety.
- (3) Do not risk entering a ponded under-construction road.
- (4) Do not take / allow children close to ponds / stagnant water, water drainage lines or any place where potholes are present.
- (5) Sensitize all concerned on risks posed by venturing into water channels and crossing nullahs during flash floods.
- (6) Do not handle / repair any electrical equipment, especially with exposed lines to preclude risk of electrocution during rainfall / thunderstorms and water pondage.

(7) Avoid staying in weak structures. In case of intense rain, seek shelter in safe places such as schools, government buildings, or any concrete buildings.

#### b. <u>DDMAs / Local Administrations / DM Responders</u>

- (1) Alert masses living in low-lying areas to exercise extra caution and activate community-based alert systems.
- (2) Limit the number of tourists allowed entry to picnic and tourist spots to avoid overcrowding.
- (3) Disseminate advisories, alerts, and guidelines to all concerned.
- (4) Regulate **traffic** at **picnic** and **tourist spots** to ensure a smooth flow and **prevent congestion**.
- (5) Provision of POL for backup generators at water pumping stations and timely pre-placement of dewatering pumps to respond to urban flooding in cities.
- (6) Secure loose structures including billboards / hoardings / solar panels from effects of windstorms / thundershowers.
- (7) Under advised of local administration and LEAs, restrict seasonal nullah crossings.
- (8) Activation and deputation of duty staff for **round-the-clock monitoring** through Emergency Operation Centers (**EOCs**).
- (9) Collect and share the **latest information** with line departments, **provincial**, and **national authorities**.
- (10) Generate Situation Reports (SITREPs) to cover any major incidents / developments.
- (11) Civic Agencies and Rescue Services (1122 / Fire Brigade / Ambulance / Civil Defence) to remain alert and have sufficient emergency response personnel and equipment during the forecasted holiday period.

#### c. **PDMA Sindh**

- (1) Coordinate with respective PDMAs to align local efforts with provincial strategies and guidelines.
- (2) Activate / ensure staffing of HR in EOCs for effective coordination and response.

- (3) Establish a **streamlined** and **efficient communication channel** to ensure **timely dissemination** of weather forecasts, **advisories**, and **alerts** to local administrations and the **public**.
- (4) Ensure flow of information among all stakeholders is accurate, timely, and effectively coordinated.
- (5) Ensure enforcement / dissemination of mitigative / preparedness / response guidelines to all concerned.
- (6) Ensure pre-placement of heavy earth moving machinery at chokepoints / at-risk regions for managing landslides and restoration of roads.
- (7) Coordinate with local administrations / line departments to proactively provide necessary resources / HR and support during emergency situations.
- (8) Ensure adequate stocking of resources / machinery / relief within provincial and district capacities. Additionally, ensure availability of resources specific to ongoing seasonal hazards.
- (9) Conduct **detailed risk / impact / vulnerability assessments** at UC to District level and tailor disaster response mechanisms accordingly.
- (10) Maintain a **comprehensive database** of **vulnerable populations** and critical infrastructure within the jurisdiction.
- (11) Ensure rapid damage and needs assessments follow major incidents.

#### d. Federal Ministries / Departments

- (1) Ensuring interagency coordination and information sharing for monitoring and handling emergencies.
- (2) Raise mass awareness through respective platforms relevant stakeholders about seasonal hazards.
- (3) Direct LEAs, NH&MP and line departments to regulate traffic flow, advised travellers / tourists regarding likely situations / dangers and safety measures.
- (4) Issue necessary instructions to departments, such as NHA, FWO and C&W for immediate restoration of roads in case of any blockage / obstruction / closures and preplacing of necessary emergency equipment at vulnerable / strategic locations.
- (5) Ensure **strict** and **proactive monitoring** of the **movement** around/ in close vicinity of nullahs and water channels to **avert possibilities** of **drowning**.

- 5. In case of any eventuality, twice-daily updates be shared with NDMA.
- 6. With the request for wider circulation and public awareness.
