WEATHER IS LIEKLY TO BECOME HOTTER

Pakistan Meteorological Department has informed that weather is likely to become Hotter with day time Maximum temperature ranges **46-48°C** in Dadu, Kamber Shahdadkot, Larkano, Jacobabad, Kashmore, Ghotki, Khairpur and Sukkur districts.

In view of the above, the Deputy Commissioner(s)/ Chairman DDMA(s) are advised to undertake following measures in addition to efforts deemed appropriate as per on ground situation / requirements:

- Establishment of Heatstroke Stabilization Centers at Public/ Private Hospitals/health facilities including mobile centres, (such centres should be established near public transit locations) by government locals/philanthropist, humanitarian organizations both local and foreign.
- Coordinate with Sindh Emergency Rescue Service 1122 and Sindh Integrated Emergency Health Service (SIEHS).
- Ensure awareness campaign to educate the public on preventive measures regarding heatwave mitigation and response.
- Establishment of helpline to address needs of affected people at priority basis.
- Assist general public in provision of cold water and necessary emergency medicines for heat stroke victims.
- Stockpile necessary emergency relief/ medicine stores in drought-affected areas.
- Authorities to take appropriate water conservation measures in both urban and rural areas.
- Ensure availability of uninterrupted power supply through intimate coordination with concerned departments and provision / availability of standby generators for heatstroke centers/hospitals.
- Emergency services and ambulances with trained paramedics to remain available around the clock, especially during daytime.
- Emergency Services / Fire Brigades to remain alert against possible fires and undertake preventative measures against fires where possible.
- Proactive Monitoring of forested areas of anticipated forest fires and timely response measures.
- Ensure availability of all forest officers / negehban / watchers and ensure frequent field visits.
- Responders to ensure that necessary firefighting equipment / vehicles are available and well-maintained, including resistant clothing, personal protective equipment, firefighting tools and communication devices.
- Pre-position firefighting resources such as fire engines, water tenders, and hand crews in strategic locations near at-risk / vulnerable forest fire areas to ensure timely response.
- Ensure widespread circulation of alerts and advisories, especially in local languages, to raise awareness and sensitize travelers / local communities.
- Coordinate with relevant departments to secure loose structures such as electrical poles, solar panels, hoardings and under-construction buildings to mitigate potential damages from dust-storms / thunderstorms.
- Advise general public to seek shelter in safe areas, such as sturdy buildings or underground structures during dust-storms / thunderstorms and avoid objects that pose a risk of falling and avoid being struck by lightning.
- Coordinate with concerned departments (NHA, NH&MP and FWO) for issuing necessary alerts to travelers, especially over long distances to take precaution avoid over exposure.
- Coordinate and facilitate the humanitarian partners in responding to the Heatwave Emergency in their areas of jurisdiction.
- Ensure timely restoration of electricity supply to residential areas as priority.



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- Ensure that farmers, dairy farmers and cattle breeders are informed of greater requirement of water for standing crops, orchards, plantations and cattle along with other precaution from adverse effects of dust-storms / thunderstorms and likely increase in temperatures.
- Establish heatstroke facilities for livestock.
- Ensure round-the-clock monitoring of the situation with Regular feedback and share Daily situation report with PDMA Sindh.

PRECAUTIONS FOR GENERAL PUBLIC:

- Drink plenty of water and fluids.
- Avoid direct exposure to sunlight, especially between 11 AM and 3 PM.
- Ensure not to place gas cylinders in the sun.
- Be vigilant in using electricity especially during peak heat times, only use air conditioners in occupied areas of the house.
- Spend time under the shade and refrain from hard labor.
- If outside, cover your head: Use a cloth, hat or umbrella. Use sun glasses to protect your eyes.
- Help others like your neighbors, relatives and friends who cannot look after themselves (e.g. unable to move themselves).
- People suffering from heart and respiratory ailments shall stay in cool atmosphere and in case of heat strokes symptoms, shall immediately consult a doctor.
- Cars should be cleared of gas materials, lighters, carbonated beverages, perfumes and device batteries in general.
- Car windows should be slightly opened (ventilation).
- Do not fill the car's fuel tank completely and refuel the car in the early morning/late evening hours.
- Do not overinflate car tires, especially during travel.

FIRST AID FOR HEAT STROKE PATIENTS:

- Wet his/her skin with cold water
- Put on the fan and if there is no electricity arrange manually to provide air.
- Gently rub ice under his/her armpits, neck and back.
- Give him/her a shower or immerse him/her in a tub of cool water.
- If he/she is capable of drinking give cold water, juice or lassi.
- ORS or saltish drinks may be mixed with plain water to treat salt loss. (fasting patients should break their fast).
- If admitted into hospital, feed him/her through intravenous injection.
- After providing first aid, consult with a doctor at nearby hospital.
