Subject <u>DUST-STORMS / THUNDERSTORM WITH ISOLATED RAINFALL ARE PREDICTED</u> FROM 28TH TO 29TH MAY.

I am directed to refer to the Weather Advisory No. F.2 (E)/2024-NDMA (MW/Weather-Advisory-XXXVIII) dated 27th May, 2024 received from the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA). Wherein, it has been forecasted that **Dust-storm/Thunderstorm with isolated rain fall** are expected in Karachi, Thatta, Badin, Hyderabad, Sujawal, Tando Muhammad Khan and Tando Allahyar districts from **28th May (evening) to 29th May 2024.**

Possible Impacts and Advises for General Public:

- Duststorm/Thunderstrom may affect daily routines, standing crops, loose structures like electric poles, solar panels, billboards etc. during the period.
- The farmers are advised to manage crops accordingly.
- Monitor the weather alerts through print media, electronic media, & social media.
- Stay indoor unless absolutely necessary. Keep doors and windows shut and avoid sitting near windows.
- Tourists are advised to avoid unnecessary traveling during the wet period.
- Maintain a distance from power lines or electrical wires. If you notice any loose electric wires or billboards in your area, alert the authorities immediately.
- Avoid parking near walls, weak residential structures, & under trees.

2. In view of the above, the Deputy Commissioner(s)/ Chairman DDMA(s), Line Departments and other relevant Authorities/ Stakeholders are requested to take necessary precautionary measures including:

- Ensure availability of dewatering machines and the staff during rainfall.
- Improve coordination with emergency services, also with various line departments.
- Establishment of helpline Cell number to address needs of affected people at priority basis.
- Ensure availability of uninterrupted power supply through intimate coordination with concerned line departments and provision / availability of standby generators for hospitals.
- Emergency services and ambulances with trained paramedics to remain available round the clock.
- Coordinate with concerned departments (NHA, NH&MP and FWO) for issuing necessary alerts to travelers, especially over long distances to take precaution and avoid over exposure to rainfall.
- Ensure removal of vulnerable Billboards, Falling Trees, Loose Electric wires, Electric poles etc.
- Ensure coordination with Rescue 1122 Authorities.






Dust-storm/ Thunderstorm with Isolated Rainfall From 28th May (Night) to 1st June 2024






Dust-storm/ Thunderstorm with Isolated Rainfall From 28th May (Evening) to 1st June 2024

2. Under the influence of this weather system, following are likely impacts: -

a. KP, GB, Galiyat, Murree and State of AJ&K

- (1) Heavy Rainfall / Thunderstorms may disrupt roads during the period.
- (2) **Tourists** are advised to **remain cautious** during the spell and check weather updates before traveling.
- (3) Electricity / other utility services may get disrupted.
- (4) **Heavy Rainfall** may generate **flash flooding** in local nullahs / streams and river tributaries.
- (5) Landslides, mudslides, may lead to potential road blockages in Upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Galiyat, Murree, Gilgit Baltistan and State of AJ&K.
- (6) Windstorms / Hailstorms may damage crops, loose structures, etc.
- (7) Thunderstorms to increase risk of lightning strikes.
- (8) **Temperatures** are likely to **drop** during the wet spell.
- (9) Farmers are advised to remain extra cautious and plan agricultural activity accordingly during the spell.
- (10) **Tourists** are advised to **remain cautious** during the spell and check weather updates before traveling.

b. Balochistan

- (1) Heavy rainfall may cause flash flooding in local nullahs.
- (2) Hill torrents are expected in Sulaiman and the Kirthar Range.
- (3) Landslides / mudslides may lead to potential road blockages.
- (4) Windstorms / Hailstorms may damage crops, loose structures, etc.
- (5) Thunderstorms to increase risk of lightning strikes.
- (6) Electricity / other utility services may get disrupted.
- (7) **Temperatures** are likely to **drop** during the wet spell.
- (8) Farmers are advised to remain extra cautious and plan agricultural activity accordingly during the spell.

c. Punjab / Sindh / Islamabad Capital Territory

- (1) Hill torrents are expected in DG Khan and Rajanpur.
- (2) **Heavy Rainfall** may generate **flash flooding** in local nullahs / streams and river tributaries.
- (3) Windstorms / Hailstorms may damage crops, loose structures, etc.
- (4) Thunderstorms to increase risk of lightning strikes.
- (5) Electricity / other utility services may get disrupted.
- (6) **Temperatures** are likely to **drop** during the wet spell.
- (7) Farmers are advised to remain extra cautious and plan agricultural activity accordingly during the spell.

- 3. All PDMAs / GBDMA / SDMA and ICT Administration, NHA, NH&MP, FWO, Rescue 1122, Dam Authorities, Line Departments, Ministries and Federal Agencies are required to undertake measures as per respective mandates. However, the following is to be ensured by all concerned, in addition to measures deemed appropriate as per on ground situation / requirements: -
 - Ensure round-the-clock monitoring of the situation through EOCs with regular feedback to PEOCs and NEOC.
 - DDMA/ District Administration are advised to relocate families to safe sites and shelters from mud houses in order to prevent casualties.
 - c. Forewarn travelers / visitors about risks posed from flooding / landslides and likely snowfall over mountains in vulnerable locations and provide guidance and assistance in case of emergencies through local administration, police and rescue services.
 - d. Ensure that in places where there is a high risk of urban floods, flash flooding, hill torrents and landslides emergency services, personnel and equipment (such as Rescue 1122, Fire Brigade, Ambulance and Civil Defense, among others) are available.
 - e. **Preplace necessary emergency equipment** at vulnerable / strategic locations to expedite response efforts and **complete stocking** / replenishment of stocks.
 - f. NH&MP and Traffic Police to coordinate with Law Enforcement Agencies to manage and redirect traffic from affected areas to safer areas, to prevent congestion and facilitate emergency response efforts.
 - g. NHA / Line Departments to conduct regular inspections of critical infrastructure, such as bridges and roads, to identify and address any vulnerability that may lead to structural damage during heavy rainfall.
 - h. PMD / FFD / PDMAs / PIDs to **proactively monitor nullahs** / **storm water drains**, to ensure their proper functioning and prevent blockages that may lead to inundation.
 - i. Ensure widespread circulation of alerts and advisories, especially in local languages, to raise awareness and sensitize travelers / tourists and local communities in at-risk / vulnerable areas.
 - j. Coordinate with relevant departments to secure loose structures such as electrical poles, solar panels, hoardings and under-construction buildings to mitigate potential damages from dust-wind / thunderstorms.
 - k. Conduct mass public awareness campaigns to educate residents and travelers in vulnerable areas about the risks of flash flooding / landslides / avalanche / blizzard and take precautionary measures.
 - I. Advise general public to seek shelter in safe areas, such as sturdy buildings or underground structures during dust-wind / hail-thunderstorms and avoid objects that pose a risk of falling / being struck by lightning.

- m. **Strengthen coordination** among all **relevant departments** and agencies to facilitate timely **sharing of information** and resources during emergency situations.
- n. **Establish reliable communication channels** with local communities to provide timely updates, instructions and emergency contact information.
- o. Advise farmers to take necessary mitigative and precautionary measures to safeguard their crops through timely harvesting, safe storage or any other precaution from adverse effects of dust-wind-thunderstorms / hailstorms and likely drop in temperatures.
- p. Special measures may be undertaken in vulnerable areas in lieu of light to moderate increase in daytime temperatures.
- q. Share daily / routine updates with NDMA in case of any eventuality.

<u>Duststorm/thunderstorm and isolated rain predicted in upper parts from 28th May to 01st June</u> Severe heatwave conditions are likely to subside.

Met office informed that a shallow westerly wave is likely to affect upper parts of the country on 28th May(evening/night). Under the influence of this weather system:

Balochistan: Duststorm/thunderstorm is expected in Quetta, Zhob, Ziarat, Sherani and Barkhan from 27th (night) to 29th May.

<u>Khyber Pakhtunkhwa:</u> Duststorm/thunderstorm with isolated rain is expected in Chitral, Dir, Swat, Abbottabad, Mansehra, Haripur, Kohistan, Shangla, Buner, Malakand, Waziristan, Kohat, Lakki Marwat, Bajaur, Mohmand, Karak, Khyber, Peshawar, Mardan and Kurram from 28th May (evening/night) to 01st June with occasional gaps.

<u>Gilgit-Baltistan/Kashmir:</u> Rain-wind/thunderstorm is expected in Gilgit-Baltistan (Diamir, Astore, Ghizer, Skardu, Hunza, Gilgit, Ghanche, Shigar), Kashmir (Neelum valley, Muzaffarabad, Rawalakot, Poonch, Hattian, Bagh, Haveli, Sudhanoti, Kotli, Bhimber, Mirpur) from <u>28th May (evening/night) to 01st June.</u>

Punjab/Islamabad: Duststorm/thunderstorm with isolated rain is expected in Islamabad/Rawalpindi, Murree, Galliyat, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Mandi Bahauddin, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Sialkot, Narowal, Lahore, Kasur, Okara, Faisalabad, Toba Tek Singh, Jhang, Khushab, Sargodha and Mianwali from 28th May (evening/night) to 01st June with occasional gaps.

Sindh: Duststorm/gusty winds is expected in Karachi, Thatta, Badin and Hyderabad on 28th and 29th May.

Possible Impacts and advises:

- The farmers are advised to manage the crops accordingly.
- Duststorm/windstorm and lightning may affect daily routines, standing crops, loose structures like electric
 poles, vehicles and solar panels etc during the period.
- Severe heatwave conditions are likely to subside in upper parts from 28th May.
- Heatwave like conditions likely in central and southern parts of the country. Day temperatures are likely to remain 03-04 °C above normal.
- · General public is advised to avoid unnecessary exposure to direct sunlight.

Note: All concerned authorities are advised to remain "ALERT" and take necessary measures to avoid any untoward situation during the heatwave spell.
